I send this email in opposition of the consolidation of the TBPTE into the TDLR and retain the TBPTE as an independent state agency for the next 12 years. If TBPTE is consolidated into TDLR, patients in the state of Texas are likely to receive low quality healthcare as TDLR commissioners are not all qualified health professionals with extensive education regarding hands on patient care.
