Our family was proud to be involved with the TLP as they interviewed, honored, and hosted my grandfather WWII veteran Chet Rohn who witnessed firsthand the horrors of the Mauthausen concentration camp in Linz Austria. His stories, and the stories of so many other Texas veterans, have been memorialized on YouTube, in museum exhibits, books, and in an educational app. Thanks to the hard work of the THGC, my grandfather's memories now form part of a curriculum for future generations of Texans.
