Dear Mr. Chairman and Members of the Board, Thank you for the opportunity to submit comments on the Sunset Advisory

Commission staff recommendation to abolish the Texas Board of Professional

Geoscientists (TBPG). I strongly disagree with this recommendation. The licensure of geoscience professionals is essential to the health, safety, and welfare of Texas citizens. Texans deserve high standards of geoscience practice, and that this requires oversight of geoscience professionals by the Texas Board of Professional Geoscientists. I am aware that many long arguments have been submitted to counter those made in the staff recommendation. I plan to keep things simple. Areas of geologic concern are all around you travel across our wonderful state. For example, the Cambria cave sinkhole that recently opened up in Williamson County, land subsidence in Houston and the Permian Basin, declining groundwater aquifer levels, coastal and stream erosion and groundwater contamination. All of these processes are affecting your constituents, and perhaps your families, as I am writing this letter. They are threats to their health, safety, and welfare. These are the types of projects that professional geoscientists are successfully working on right now and we are the only group of professionals with the required training to address these issues.
