Opposed: The Sunset Advisory Commission has recommended that the licensure for Dyslexia Therapists and Practitioners, along with ten other licensures, be discontinued. The goal is to eliminate certain functions at the Department of Health Services to enable you to focus more intently on mental health services. I oppose getting rid of the licensure for dyslexia therapists. This is a terrible mistake. The public schools barely teach and identify dyslexic students as it stands. Most 'reading facilitators in public schools are not Dyslexia Therapists! Most public school reading facilitators don't even know what they are doing, they receive minimal training from the districts. Instead of taking away the licensure, more strict rules governing who can teach dyslexics should be implemented.
