Your Comments About the Staff Report, Including Recommendations Supported or Opposed:

I am a licensed professional counselor and a member of the American Counseling Association (ACA), the world's largest organization representing professional counselors in various practice settings.

ACA and the Texas Counseling Association (TCA) support the Texas Sunset Commission findings that "the boards are acting in good faith and have made notable strides in addressing the previously identified problems...However, significant problems and challenges remain that cannot be resolved within the current structure" and "the continued administrative attachment of the marriage and family therapy, professional counseling and social work boards to a large agency...is still not working...The dysfunction created by such a model places the livelihoods of licensees in jeopardy and puts the public at risk."

Any Alternative or New Recommendations on This Agency:

We recommend that the structure of the BHEC, as proposed during the last Sunset Review, include one professional and one public member appointed by each board, with the presiding officer appointed by the Governor. Currently, no board that regulates health professionals in Texas is composed exclusively of public members. In fact, the Sunset Commission staff recommendations for the Board of Medical Examiners do not propose to restructure that Board to create an all or majority public member structure.

Including professional members on the BHEC is much more likely to enhance consistency in standards of practice, licensing and enforcement decisions because no single profession would hold a majority on the BHEC."
