I spoke at length to BON regarding the delay of Excelsior and the bogus way the school is trying to force the students to do clinicals. The program will not allow the students to get their own preceptors and do actual clinical labs and skill sign offs in local facilities. Yet, the students are expected to complete the program and wait almost a year to “take the final exam” for graduation—eligibility to take NCLEX.

Here is the information related to Excelsior College ADON stating the 7-12 month wait time before graduates can get sign offs and sit for boards (which is decreasing pass rate) BUT will NOT allow students to go else where fore “actual” clinicals, and College Network, ripping off the nursing students.

This school should be shut down and money refunded!
