Opposed: I agree with the Commission's recommendation that these organizations be consolidated into one. As noted, the backlog of complaints and licensing is a failure that must be remedied. We need to ensure that the professional credibility of the counseling profession is upheld by effective enforcement of standards across the profession. Additionally, the backlog in licensing serves as an additional hurdle for entry into the counseling profession. This unnecessary, and preventable, issue must be remedied for the future of the profession.
