I am writing on behalf of myself, a licensed physical therapist, in opposition of a recent issue regarding the TBPTE taking over the CCAP program (issue #3). I believe the TBPTE should continue it's current role as statutory authority rather than change roles. Reasoning for this includes primarily the lack of *clinical* expertise for those who might serve on this board.
