Plumbing has been my whole life and my goals were to earn my Masters, I've accomplished that and now I'm in jeopardy of losing my RMP. I have 2 drain cleaners employed, if their endorsements are dissolved, it will leave 2 young men without jobs. They will no longer be able to perform their job duties and they will be expected to keep their current pay. This will drive costs up to consumers because I won't be able to decrease their pay to a straight apprentice rates, lose the income of their truck, and keep costs the same. It will decrease my company's bottom line. It's hard enough to find good help, especially licensed plumbers, as it is.

Any Alternative or New Recommendations on This Agency: Keep the TSBPE, allow them more funding for more enforcement field agents, and increase the penalty for performing plumbing without the proper license to a Class B misdemeanor.
