I respectfully request that the Sunset Committee for the Texas Medical Board please consider granting more lenient provisions for providers of holistic and naturopathic healing. As a citizen of the great state of Texas, I deserve to freely choose the type of medical care I deem appropriate.

As a witness to your committee meeting at the Texas State Capitol today, I heard several members mention the fact that too many citizens are dying under our current medical system. Through much personal research, I too have come to realize that allopathic (mainstream) medicine is lacking in it's ability to treat (or dare say, cure) chronic illness. Pharmaceutical intervention, the central theme of the mainstream medical profession, only results in more health problems, which in turn undermines overall functioning; this is proven by the multitude of television commercials by attorneys represented victims of the latest pharmaceutical nightmare.
