Your Comments About the Staff Report, Including Recommendations Supported or Opposed: I oppose the suggestion to eliminate instructors licenses.

Instructors are trained not just in the elements and profession of cosmetology and barbering, but also in teaching methods, learning styles, how to teach to various learning styles. The professional behind the chair does not have that training, and are therefore unqualified to teach in a beauty school environment. You discount the thousands of hours of advanced education I (and other instructors) have spent in over 20 years of teaching.

If you remove the licensing requirements, you are minimizing and reducing the quality of education these aspiring professionals will receive. I saw no supporting documents to suggest that this should even be considered.

Any Alternative or New Recommendations on This Agency: Instructors ought to be required more continuing education in current cosmetology and barbering practices. I suggest an additional 4 hours.
