Opposed: Eliminating Cosmetology Instructor licenses is a serious mistake.

After getting an operator's license, there is additional training in curriculum and lesson design that is crucial to being a successful Cosmetology instructor. The instructor certificate and the years of experience currently required is an assurance to the school district that the individual is qualified to teach high school students. Currently, our high school students earn the Operator license immediately after leaving high school.
