Opposed: I am a licensed clinical social worker practicing independently in Austin, Texas. I have served as a social worker in my community for 23 years. It is vital that we have strong oversight from our professional boards. I support the creation of the BHEC through the transformation of the psychology board. I oppose the classification of professional appointees on the BHEC as ex-officio members. The TSBSWE is not operating efficiently and effectively under HHSC. Each board must remain independent under the BHEC.

Any Alternative or New Recommendations on This Agency: I am in support of the recommendation to create the Behavioral Health Executive Council to house all four behavioral health regulatory agencies and to expand the composition of BHEC to include professional representation from each board as voting members. I am in support of NASW's recommendation that the BHEC be structured as proposed during the last Sunset Review and include 9 total voting members:

one professional and one public member appointed by each board and the presiding officer be a public member appointed by the Governor.
