Opposed: I feel that our trust with the court system in Texas would be in jeopardy if we do away with the current instructor licensing and the thorough curriculum reviews now in place. I am opposed to changing these. In addition, simply listing an instructor or provider name on a list for the consumer to make an informed decision on which class to take sounds burdensome on the customer.
