Your Comments About the Staff Report, Including Recommendations Supported or Opposed: "Dune Buggy" is a loose term which can describe a variety of vehicles. Vehicles which actually drive on the sand and those which never leave the road.

Any Alternative or New Recommendations on This Agency:

All homebuilt vehicles should be treated the same, rat rods, replicas, street rods, kit cars, home built. They should not be treated as a manufactured car in which is sold to the public in large production. The ASE safety inspections required in which to get these vehicles registered for road use are suffice in determining if a vehicle is safe to be driven on the road. It is important to emphasize that banning and restricting vehicles of this class any further does not serve the public good. Builders should have the freedom to express themselves in their vehicles if that is what they wish to do. Not providing a clear pathway to get a homebuilt vehicle registered will only create scenarios in which the ASE safety inspection is bypassed and puts the public at risk. That is why it is imperative to have a clear and concise process in which to get homebuilt vehicle registered.
