Without infection Control education harm to all involved from cross contamination could occur. As well lack of formalized education in Radiology could cause a DA to overexpose a patient or the DA.
I believe it's necessary for DA's to know state laws and SBDE (Board) rules, to prevent a DA from harming her/himself or a patient.
Any DA who has not been educated in nitrous monitoring would not know the signs and symptoms to recognize a patient in distress or how to react.
The dentist's liability insurance does not cover acts of ignorance, incompetence, or other damages caused by delegated duties performed by assistants. ,
It is the State of Texas responsibility and mission to protect the public from avoidable harm, and I believe it has been successful in this regard by licensing Dental Assistants.
