I believe that the advanced degree (Masters and above), thousands of hours of training required during and post graduation, prior to full licensure) and continuing education requirements are a must for not only solid training for counselors but also service as protection to the clientele served. There is a certain baseline that must be learned and attained prior to full licensure, and to lessen that is a tremendous risk to the profession and the clientele serviced.
