I have a puppy mill rescue dog. Scout never had a puppy life. She spent her entire first year in an extremely small enclosure with pea gravel. She never had a toy, stepped on the grass, or had a kind word. I know she didn't have a kind word because the puppy miller registered her name with AKC as "Perfidy." Her littermates had similar ugly hateful names. Most people see puppies and say aww! Puppy millers see puppies as crops and just say ugh.

The puppy mill was raising my dog to be sold for thousands of dollars. They chipped her for inventory purposes, but she never had one single shot or medication until the day before a rescue came to pick her. I know because I have her medical record. Any Alternative or New Recommendations on This Agency:

Puppy mills need more oversite, not less. They don't see dogs the way the rest of us do, so it is our job to keep an eye on them.

Puppy Mills are selling puppies as 100% purebred for a premium to be pets, show dogs, or bred. My Scout was being sold as 100% Norwich, but a DNA test shows she is 1/4 Cairn. She does not qualify to be shown or registered with the AKC. Someone who bought her would have been defrauded of thousands. A purebred Norwich Terrier can sell for \$4,000. More over site is needed to quell this common practice.
