Opposed: I was an early supporter of the License process and worked on the Houston Geological Society in helping to get the process approved. After being "grand-fathered" into the program with more than 35-years of experience, I maintained my license until 2008. I voluntarily relinquished it at that time because I had seen no need for the designation. I was AIPG Certified Professional Geologist and licensed in Wyoming for many years.

After more than 50-years of employment as an active Geoscientist in the mining and Oil & Gas business I have yet to see any opportunity where the license requirement kept me from doing the jobs requested. Pre-existing State and Federal regulations have been more that adequate to assure public safety.
