Your Comments About the Staff Report, Including Recommendations Supported or Opposed: The Sunset Staff Report recommended discontinuing the Dental Laboratory Certification Council. I strongly disagree with this recommendation. The Texas laboratory industry and the technicians that work in them play an integral role in the dentistry that patients in Texas receive. The DLCC and it's members provide the knowledge base that is imperative in maintaining the highest standards in laboratory licensing in Texas. The Sunset Report stated the importance of the Board keeping up with trends in dentistry. Rapidly changing trends are also happening in the Texas Lab industry. Everyday more and more out of state and foreign countries are doing business in Texas and having a direct impact on patient prosthetics.
