Your Comments About the Staff Report, Including Recommendations Supported or Opposed:

As a Registered Professional Land Surveyor practicing in the State of Texas, I believe strongly that a Board made up of Professional Surveyors and public members is the best means of regulating the profession of land surveying to protect the health, safety, welfare and property of the citizens of Texas.

The areas of concern listed in the Sunset Staff Report can and should be addressed within TBPLS. A combined Board made up of a majority of board members from a different profession as proposed by the Sunset Staff Report is not the most effective means to properly regulate the practice of Land Surveying in Texas. Professional Land Surveying in Texas and the laws related to property rights are unique and complicated framework of land title and tenure. Protecting real estate holdings, the bedrock of our state's economy and many of our citizen's most important investment, requires a regulatory board made up of subject matter experts and public members.

I oppose the proposed combination of the Land Surveying and Engineering Boards. Both of these professions require diligent and expert regulation that a combined Board will not effectively provide.

Any Alternative or New Recommendations on This Agency: I recommend that the Texas Board of Professional Land Surveying be given the opportunity to address the concerns listed in the Sunset Staff Report and remain an independent licensing agency.
