Issue 2 Border Security Performance — agree AND more to be done, see comments

*Forty percent of crime guns sold to Mexico come from Texas. There is not evidence that DPS has a focus on stopping this deadly Texas export issue.

*The Sunset staff report the importance of measuring the return on investment on DPS border related staffing. I would encourage the analysis to include a return on investment comparison between (a) border security and (b) promoting gun safety and analyzing firearm-related crimes to target interventions.

Issue 4 Nonstandard Regulatory Processes — Agree more needs to be done—see comments

*In relation to firearm safety and handgun licensing, I could not agree more.

*Handgun licensing demonstrates the deficient regulatory information. Different # of LTC complaints from three different sources at DPS.

*License to Carry issues referred to Criminal Investigation Division 37, no investigations. Error or danger.

*In the DPS Self-Evaluation Report, DPS indicates that for FY 2016, of the 3,575 regulated entities, 21 were inspected. This lack of inspection is a danger to public safety.

*The DPS Self-evaluation report and the Sunset staff report indicate that there is no central repository of complaints against regulated persons or entities in handgun licensing.
