Opposed: I do not believe that dune buggies, sand rails, and Volkswagen based "kit cars" should be outlawed. They have been produced and driven on the highways beside regular cars and motorcycles since the 1960's with no major problems. They are no less safe than motorcycles. The people with these cars have them as a hobby and a passion, and care about their own safety enough to design the cars accordingly. Many of them have more safety features than the original Volkswagen beetles.
