I am a third year Doctor of Physical Therapy student at Texas Woman's University in Houston, Texas.

I am emailing to share some of my concerns I have about the proposal to combine the current PT board (TBPTE) with TDLR. I strongly recommend that the TBPTE stay an independent state agency.

My first concern is that the TDLR commissioners do not have the proper medical knowledge or specific healthcare experience to make appropriate decisions involving patient care that is delivered by physical therapists. I personally am pursuing my doctoral level degree in physical therapy and feel that I have been been provided with exceptional knowledge and clinical skills that I would love to implement into my future practice.
