Dear Sunset Review Commission:

My name is Jordan C. White, DC. I am licensed to practice Chiropractic in Texas since 1985. I also maintained a license to practice in Florida from 1985 until last year. I let it lapse. I agree with the decision regarding the abolishment of the facility registration process and the implementation of the biennial process for the completion of Continuing education and license renewal as recommended by your panel.

Both of the above mentioned issues have negatively impacted Chiropractors in Texas for years. Having experienced the biennial license process in Florida since 1985 I can assure you it much more efficient and user friendly than the process in Texas.

I have no objection to background checks or fingerprinting for currently practicing doctors either.

I commend you on your excellent analysis of the problems with our board. I do not currently have an opinion for or against consolidation with another agency at this time. I will attend if possible the meeting in November to gather more information. However, I do hope that the above mentioned facility registration requirement is abolished and the biennial renewal process adopted. I also suggest that the board accept continuing education credits from any accredited medical, dental, osteopathic, chiropractic or podiatry institution in order to satisfy the required educational hours. I feel this would further streamline the process for both the board and the renewing Chiropractor.
