Of all the items in the report, this is the one that I believe has some relevance. TDLR does have the infrastructure to stream line this process to a point. The practical hands on portion is important. I believe this is the only piece that would improve under TDLR.

TDLR.

As I mentioned the infrastructure for testing is the only thing I think they can do better. Enforcement from TDLR, in my opinon, has been very lacking.

In all my years in the field I can not recall seeing a single TDLR enforcement agent. I can not tell you the number of times I have seen the TSBPE field agent out in the field. He has asked for my license and the license of everyone else each time I have seen him. He has even asked to see the HVAC employees license or certification. I asked him about it, and he said that they help each other out checking licenses.

I think that it would be detrimental to the plumbing industry in general if it were rolled under the umbrella of TDLR
