Your Comments About the Staff Report, Including Recommendations Supported or Opposed:

I am opposed to the recommendations under Issue 3. The commission should not be eliminated. What should be eliminated is the NCT license. As a LMRT you receive 1500 hours of training both in class and in clinic. These people are qualified and knowledgeable in Radiation Protection and safety. Having this knowledge greatly reduces over exposure to patients and the whole population.

When compared to the measly 120 hours required of the NCT, they don't know anything about radiation biology and the harmful effects of radiation. They pose a huge threat to the community with their lack of knowledge and lack of training. I know if my mother was getting an x-ray examination, I would want the best of the best taking care of her and the NCT can not provide this type of care, because they are not qualified in any way to administer harmful ionizing radiation.

Any Alternative or New Recommendations on This Agency: My recommendation is to get rid of the NCT license. Stop the temporary license and make the exam one comprehensive exam, pass or fail. LMRT are an essential part of the healthcare community and lots of doctors depend on the skills of our highly trained LMRT's.
